





EQAO is a province-wide assessment linked to curriculum that all Gr8 graduating students wrote in Grade 3 and Grade 6. The provincial standard is Level 3 or 70%.

Both provincial and Durham District School board data clearly show that if students met the provincial standard in EQAO in Grade 3 and/or Grade 6 that they have a high probability of reaching their potential and being successful in the Academic stream in high school.

Both provincial and Durham District School board data also show that if students did not meet provincial standard in EQAO in Grade 3 and/or Grade 6 that they have the ability to close learning gaps with support from families and schools to reach their potential and be successful in the Academic, Applied or Locally Developed/Essential streams in high school.

"Choosing My Success" is about ensuring all Grade 8 students are supported through the course selection process for high school in order to make thoughtful, evidence-informed decisions while setting high expectations to reach their potential.






